### THE POWER **OF CAMP**



#### **MIRACLE CAMP IS ESTABLISHED**

In 1965, the Fellowship of Evangelical Churches (FEC) was looking for property to purchase for a youth camp. The University of Notre Dame was selling a camp on a largely dried up lake in Southwest Michigan. Through a generous donation for the exact amount of the down payment, the FEC was able to puchase this property. The water level rose back up and the name "Miracle Camp" was given to remember God's provision.

#### **BANKSON LODGE DEDICATION**

After almost 40 years using the same lodge that was used by Notre Dame in the 60's, construction on Bankson Lodge was completed and the building began to be used. This addition to camp's lodging replaced old and outdated housing in the previous lodge with beautiful hotel-style rooms that faced the lake. Bankson Lodge allowed more guests, especially families and groups, to enjoy all that camp had to offer.



#### **EVERGREEN RENOVATION**





### **OUR VISION** FOR THE FUTURE

As our demand increases and our capacity fills, we need to expand our program, property, and personnel to more effectively spread the gospel.

We never want to expand simply to add to our camp numbers, **but rather to create an excellent**, **life-changing experience for the local church to achieve the same ministry goals that we have**. Namely, to encourage people to make Jesus the Lord of their lives.

#### IMMEDIATE CHALLENGES

The wastewater system is at capacity so we cannot add more buildings to meet guest needs

Our current gymnasium is at capacity and does not fit all guests, especially in bad weather

There is not a great space to easily welcome guests

The maintenance shop is old, an eyesore, and in the middle of guest experiences.

Retail locations are not in ideal locations or large enough to efficiently meet guest needs

#### ADDITIONAL CHALLENGES

We're hitting capacity but needing to increase current budget

There's a lack of staff housing

We need to expand all facilities peripheral to lodging (chapel, dining hall, community spaces, multipurpose center, etc.)

Summer break for schools is shrinking (we need more beds to increase weekly capacity)

There are long wait times for activities so we need to add more recreation and lodging in the northern woods



#### **OUR PROPOSAL & BUDGET**

Currently our top priorities (wastewater, gym, welcome center/offices, and retail/coffee space) equal an estimated \$12 million. However, we have other priorities and therefore the total overall cost is likely closer to \$20 million over 10 years.

This proposal is not set in stone; just the first draft. We want to hear your feedback so we can make sure our plan will meet the needs of our ministry and guests well.
